Thank you to all the club members who came out to the AGM held Sunday January 27, 2014 at the Clubhouse on Grey Mountain Road. While 86 members came to renew their membership and pick up their gate key, a stalwart group of 56 stuck around for the meeting. The overwhelming decision of the club members present was to move forward with the upgrading and improvements to the clubhouse that will ultimately see the addition of a water source to support inclusion of proper kitchen and bathroom facilities.

The range will be very busy this summer with competitions and exercise and training sessions for various enforcement agencies, youth groups and programs organized by the Yukon Fish & Game Association. The Yukon Silhouette Rifle Championships is a registered shoot in preparation for the Canadian National Silhouette Rifle Championships. The Alaska State Troopers are coming to face-off against the Yukon RCMP in their Annual Shoot and a variety of fun shooting events are scheduled to entice members to come and try a new shooting discipline. Don't be confused by the web calendar. While there is a significant amount of time, especially in May, that parts of the range are booked for groups such as Brinks, RCMP, Conservation and various other government agencies, they are using the PPC range leaving the other areas of the range open for member use during the day. They require range time to main-



GENERAL REMINDERS

- If you had a gate key last year, and your membership for 2014 is still outstanding, you risk having that gate key reassigned to a current member in good standing who has completed an orientation tour.
- Please pick up your brass when you have finished shooting and deposit it into the brass collection pails. The club earns a few dollars by taking it to Raven Recycling.
- Many members have email addresses. To streamline the communication process, please go to the club web page and enter your email address to subscribe to WRPC News and receive notifications of new posts by email. Join 178 other subscribers !

It is not unusual to see wildlife on the range property. Foxes, bears, sheep, deer and even caribou and moose have all wandered onto the different range areas. Do not shoot at these animals in an attempt to scare them off. They tend to be somewhat accustomed to the sound of guns. Call a cease fire and wait for them to move to a safe area before resuming your activity. Remember that all wildlife is protected on the range.

- Centre fire shooting is not permitted on Tuesday evenings when the Trap group is shooting.
- Respect the targets and rails. The metallic silhouette targets cannot withstand the constant assault of large caliber rifles. The heavy metal clangers are there for the heavy caliber guns. Please use them.
- We certainly seem to have a significant number of hand gun enthusiasts using the three handgun areas. Please take note that you should not be shooting centre fire guns at the rim fire rails. Use only centre fire targets on the centre fire rails.
- To relieve some of the pressure at the Falling Plates range and to ensure that hand gun users have appropriate targets, one of our club members constructed two heavy metal target stands which are positioned on the silhouette handgun range. They should withstand up to .44 magnum loads.

WHAT DO THE RANGE FLAGS MEAN?

The RED/GREEN flags control the firing line



RED FLAG

The firing line of the range area in use is LIVE or ACTIVE.

This means that shooting is allowed.

Raise this flag when shooting is permitted from the firing line at the range area that is in use.

NO ONE GOES DOWN RANGE when the RED FLAG is raised..

Remember: "Red you're Dead!"

YELLOW FLASHING LIGHTS

Located at rifle range only.

Activated along with the GREEN FLAG to indicate that people are down range.



GREEN FLAG

This means a CEASE FIRE is in effect.

The firing line is no longer active or live.

Raise this flag to show that it is now SAFE TO GO DOWN RANGE and set up targets.

No handling of firearms when the green flag is raised and people are down range.
